1. Another name for the Acer is the **Maple**
2. Linden trees are called **Lime trees** in the UK
3. The 20-metre-tall Christmas tree normally donated by Norway for Trafalgar Square is a **Spruce** (Norway spruce)
4. The name of the popular garden tree, with yellow pea-flowers, which are also sometimes called golden chain or golden rain is the **Laburnum**
5. The tree in the British Isles that produces conkers is the **Horse Chestnut tree**
6. Trees that drop their leaves at the end of the growing season and produce new leaves in the spring are **deciduous trees**
7. **Yews** are often found in churchyards
8. **Brazil** is a country and a tree
9. Dendrochronology is the method of **calculating a tree's age by counting its rings**
